**REPRESENTATION:**

Committee is comprised of nine regular members and one alternate. There is also one liaison from the City Council and one liaison from the Planning Commission. In appointment of the members, special emphasis is to be placed to ensure equitable representation by business owners/managers and residents within the City.

**PURPOSE:**

1. To promote community understanding of, and involvement in, the community development process and activities funded by US Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD), Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), and/or HOME Investment Partnership Act (HOME) funds.
2. To serve as an advisory body to the Costa Mesa City Council and Costa Mesa Housing Authority with respect to major new activities.
3. To serve as an advisory body to the City Council and Costa Mesa Housing Authority on activities funded by HUD, CDBG, and/or HOME funds, in fulfillment of the City's Citizen Participation Plan.

**SCHEDULED MEETINGS:**

Ad Hoc Committee will meet as necessary by the decision of the Economic Development and Development Services Director or the City Council.

**TERMS:**

All members' terms are two years; six members are assigned to odd numbered years and three members are assigned to even numbered years. Alternates who are moved to an incumbent's term will fulfill that term and then may reapply as a regular member.
