FIREWORK STAND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

The Costa Mesa Municipal Code contains regulations governing the issuance of fireworks permits and the discharge of fireworks. These regulations are found in Sections 9-179 through 9-190. The City Council has also adopted Council Policy 400-2 (revised 02/19/13), which imposes additional regulations governing the sale and discharge of fireworks (copy attached).

Applications must be filed before **June 1** of the calendar year for which permit is sought. The following requirements must also be met:

SCHOOL APPLICANTS

1. High School applicants must attach a letter from the school's Principal certifying the applicant is a recognized organization supporting school activities and must certify that the organization is a tax exempt charity or non-profit organization under state and federal law in good standing or approved Newport Mesa Unified School District entity under direct control of the school.
2. Copy of temporary Seller's Permit from the State Board of Equalization
3. Copy of State Fire Marshal Retail Fireworks License
4. Original insurance certification naming the City of Costa Mesa as additional insured
5. Copy of site plan which must be approved by Building & Safety, Traffic Engineering and the Fire Department


1. Copy of Articles of Incorporation (including amendments)
2. Copy of By-Laws
3. Current roster of officers/directors which includes name, address, and telephone number
4. Current roster of members which includes name, address, and age
5. Copies of tax exempt status from the Internal Revenue Service and the State Franchise Tax Board
6. Copy of temporary Seller's Permit from the State Board of Equalization
7. Copy of State Fire Marshal Retail Fireworks License
8. Original insurance certification naming the City of Costa Mesa as additional insured
9. Copy of site plan which must be approved by Building & Safety, Traffic Engineering and the Fire Department

The United States Flag Code permits nighttime display of the American flag when the flag is illuminated. It is the responsibility of the firework stand operator and associated firework distributor to ensure that the flag is illuminated at night when displayed. As an alternative, the City suggests that the American flag be taken down at night.

FIRE DEPARTMENT (714) 327-7400: Each Fireworks Stand will be inspected for fire-safe conditions during the time of occupancy, and a final inspection will be conducted in order to release the deposit for clean-up. Fireworks Stands are to be cleaned up before midnight of Thursday, July 7th.

BUILDING & SAFETY DIVISION (714) 754-5273: An Electrical Permit must be obtained from the City of Costa Mesa prior to the performance of any electrical work.

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING (714) 754-5323: Site plan must be approved in relation to possible interruption of traffic.

Harbor Trinity Church Constitution

ARTICLE I – NAME

The Church shall be called the Harbor Trinity Church.

ARTICLE II – INCORPORATION

The Church is incorporated under the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE III – AFFILIATION

The local Church is autonomous and is not subject to the control of any ecclesiastical body. It is affiliated in fellowship with the Southern California Association of the North American Baptist Conference. In the event of dissolution, all remaining assets shall become the property of the North American Baptist Conference.

ARTICLE IV – MISSION

Harbor Trinity is committed to raising up mature disciples who intentionally help people find and follow Jesus.

ARTICLE V – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Admission:

Upon the recommendation of the Pastor overseeing membership and vote of the Elder Board, any person who completes the Membership Class and has been baptized, subscribes to the doctrinal statement and agrees to the Church covenant may become a Member of the Church upon a simple majority vote of the Members.

- a) Names of proposed candidates will be posted in the lobby and in the bulletin two weeks prior for Members to pray for and respond to the intention of the candidate(s). Any issues that would seem contradictory to membership should be taken to an Elder or Pastor for resolution prior to acceptance.
- b) Baptism – Testimony of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and believes baptism by immersion in the name of the Trinity.
- c) Restoration – A Member can be restored assuming the above conditions are met and there is satisfactory evidence of Christian life and conduct after the cessation of membership.

Section 2. Termination:

Upon the review and recommendation of the Pastor overseeing membership and concurrence of the Elder Board, and a simple majority vote of the Members, the termination of a Member may result from

- a) Death (automatic).
- b) Removal – After one year of no contact or no contribution to the Church or upon the joining of another church of any faith.
- c) Discipline – Upon evidence of disregard of the Church covenant or misconduct according to Biblical standards where repentance is not expressed.

- d) Transfer – By a letter to another church of like faith and practice stating that the Member is active and in good standing with the Church upon the formal written request by a Member who wishes to be dropped from membership.

ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS

Section 1. Corporate Officers:

The principal officers of the Corporation shall be the President, the Treasurer and the Secretary. The Moderator (Chairman of the Elder Board) shall be designated President. The Secretary shall maintain control of the corporate seal and all legal documents.

The Board of Elders shall act as the Board of Directors of the Corporation. They shall determine the policies and exercise control, supervision and direction of the general management of the Corporation. The activities and affairs of the Corporation are conducted and all corporate powers are exercised by or under the direction of the Board of Elders.

Section 2. Elders:

The Elders shall have been Members for a minimum of one year and shall have evidenced spiritual maturity and leadership according to the standards outlined in I Timothy 3:1-7. Elders shall be elected by the Members to a two year term at the Annual Business Meeting.

The Elder Board shall consist of eight Elders, two of which are the Moderator and the Senior Pastor. All members of the Elder Board shall have voting privileges.

The Elder Board shall be responsible for the following:

- a. Setting Church policy
- b. Setting the Spiritual direction of the Church and monitoring its spiritual health
- c. Advising, supporting, and holding the Senior Pastor accountable for the ministries of the Church
- d. Long range planning to fulfill the Church vision
- e. Establishing the annual budget to be presented to the Members for approval
- f. Overseeing the financial health of the Church
- g. Approving the Church ministry structure
- h. Acting as Corporate Board of Directors
- i. All other duties as outlined in this Constitution.

Section 3. Moderator

The Moderator shall be an Elder and meet all the requirements for an Elder. The Moderator shall be elected by the Members to a two-year term.

The Moderator shall be responsible for:

- a. Calling meetings of the Elder Board and serving as its Chairman
- b. Chairing Church Business meetings

ARTICLE VII – BY-LAWS

Section 1. Voting:

All Members 16 years of age and older shall have full voting privileges, except for legal matters, at any Church Business Meeting. For votes on legal matters, Members shall be at least 18 years old. There shall be only one vote per person. All votes must be made in person at the Business Meeting.

Section 2. Meetings:

The Annual Meeting for elections and to pass the Annual Budget shall be held in the final month of the fiscal year. Notice of such meeting and its purpose must be announced at two regular Sunday Worship Services with the agenda posted, and material to be considered, provided at least two Sundays prior to the meeting.

Annual Reports shall be made available to the congregation by the Church Staff.

Written Quarterly Reports, which will include a Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement and the Fund Balance, shall be made available in the Church office.

Special Business Meetings shall be called as necessary by the Moderator or upon a written request of 10% of the Members. Notice of such a meeting and its purpose must be announced at two regular Sunday Worship services and posted at least two Sundays prior to the meeting.

The Elder Board meetings shall be held regularly as required and duly called by the Moderator.

Section 3. Quorum:

A quorum at any Church Business Meeting shall be 10% of the voting Members. In the calling of, or termination of, the Senior Pastor, a quorum shall be 50% of the voting Members.

A quorum at any Elder Board meeting shall be five Elders.

Section 4. Majority Vote:

A simple majority vote shall have the support of 51% of the Members voting. An affirmative majority vote shall have the support of 67% of the Members voting. Approval of all motions within the Elder Board requires the support of 65% of the Elders present votes to pass.

Section 5. Fiscal Year:

The fiscal year of the Church shall be from July 1 to June 30. All elected and appointed terms of office shall be consistent with the fiscal year.

Section 6. Amendments:

Amendments to the Constitution, Church Covenant, and Doctrinal Statement may be proposed by the Elder Board or by a petition of 10% of the voting Members. Any Constitutional amendment shall be posted for two weeks prior to being voted on. All amendments shall be passed by an affirmative majority vote at any Church Business Meeting.

Section 7. Rules of Order:

Harbor Trinity Church Constitution

All Church business, Board or Committee meetings shall be governed by a current edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 8. Faith and Practice

All faith and practice of Harbor Trinity Church shall be in accordance with its Doctrinal Statement. All parties proposing to use the church facility for religious activities such as, but not limited to, communion, baptism, worship services, weddings, and funerals, must be in agreement with Harbor Trinity's Doctrinal Statement. Use of the facilities for non-religious purposes may be allowed provided the organization's activity, and/or values, does not contradict our Doctrinal Statement and is approved by the Pastoral Staff. Harbor Trinity Staff will not officiate or co-officiate at any service or activity that is not in accordance with the Harbor Trinity Doctrinal Statement.

Section 9. Vice-Moderator:

An Elder shall be elected Vice-Moderator at the first Elder Board meeting of the fiscal year to serve in the absence of the Moderator.

Section 10. Pastoral Resignation/Termination:

The Senior Pastor may resign upon three months written notice.

The Senior Pastor may be terminated upon three months written notice following an affirmative majority vote of the members at any duly called Business Meeting of the Church.

The requirement for three months written notice may be waived upon the mutual consent of the Members and the Senior Pastor.

All other Pastoral and Church Staff positions may be self-terminated by a letter of resignation or terminated by recommendation of the Senior Pastor upon ratification of the Elder Board.

Section 10. Expenditure Limited:

A simple majority vote of the Members shall be required prior to any financial expenditure over \$4,000 above budgeted amount.

Section 11. Pulpit Committee:

Following the resignation or the termination of the Senior Pastor, a Pulpit Committee shall be formed consisting of the Elder Board. The Moderator shall assume the responsibilities of the Senior Pastor and, with the Elder Board's approval, provide for all pulpit supply.

Section 12. Denominational Delegates:

The Pastors, Elders and Directors may serve as delegates upon signifying their intention to attend Denominational Conferences and meetings.

Section 13. Authority:

Upon approval, this Constitution and accompanying by-laws shall supersede all previous Constitutions and by-laws of Harbor Trinity Church; also known as Harbor Trinity Baptist Church.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

HARBOR TRINITY BAPTIST CHURCH

- (1) The name of this corporation is HARBOR TRINITY BAPTIST CHURCH.
- (2) The purposes for which this corporation is formed are:
 - (a) To establish and maintain a Church and to provide a place of public worship for the same at or near the city of Costa Mesa, county of Orange, state of California.
 - (b) To establish, maintain and conduct schools for the religious instruction of the young, and to further other religious and charitable work.
 - (c) To sue and be sued in its corporate name; to make contracts and to receive property by devise or bequest, subject to the laws regulating the transfer of property by will.
 - (d) To carry on any business whatsoever which this corporation may deem proper or convenient in connection with any of the foregoing purposes or otherwise, or which may be calculated directly or indirectly to promote the interest of this corporation, or to enhance the value of its property or business.
 - (e) To borrow money; to lend money; to own real property; to own personal property; to deal in real property; to deal in personal property; to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of the State of California upon corporations formed under the laws pursuant to and under which this corporation is formed, as such laws are now in effect or may at any time hereafter be enacted or amended.

The foregoing statement of purposes shall be construed as a statement of both powers and purposes, and the purposes and powers stated in each clause shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms or provisions of any other clause, but shall be regarded as independent purposes.

(3) The principal office for the transaction of the business of this corporation is to be located in the County of Orange, State of California.

(4) This corporation is organized pursuant to Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 1 of the Corporations Code.

(5) This corporation shall be nonstock and no dividends or pecuniary profits shall be declared to the members thereof.

(6) The number of directors is five, and the names and addresses of the persons who are appointed to act as the first directors are:

(7) The private property of the members of this Corporation shall not be subject to payment of any of the debts or other obligations of this corporation.

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(8) The By-laws of this corporation shall be adopted by the Directors named in the Articles of Incorporation and may thereafter be amended or repealed by any means provided in the By-laws.

1. That they are the pastors and members of the Board of Deacons of HARBOR TRINITY BAPTIST CHURCH, Costa Mesa, California, a California corporation.
2. That at a meeting of the Board of Deacons of said corporation, duly held at Costa Mesa, California, on June 3, 1971, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED: That the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation are hereby amended by the addition of a new Article, being Article (9), to read as follows:
"The property of this corporation is hereby irrevocably dedicated to religious and charitable purposes and upon the liquidation, dissolution or abandonment of the owner, after providing for the debts and obligations thereof, the remaining assets will not inure to the benefit of any private person, but will be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation or corporation organized and operated exclusively for religious and charitable purposes similar to this corporation and which fund, foundation or corporation shall have established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code."

3. That at a meeting of the members of said corporation, duly held at Costa Mesa, California, on June 27, 1971, a resolution was adopted, and the wording of the amended article as set forth in the members' resolution is the same as that set forth in the Board of Deacons' resolution in Paragraph 2 of this Certificate.

4. That the number of members who voted affirmatively for the adoption of said resolution is 50, and that the number of members constituting a quorum is 45.

To Whom It May Concern:

Harbor Trinity Baptist Church, Costa Mesa, California is granted tax-exempt status as a result of its affiliation with the North American Baptist Conference.

All churches and church-sponsored organizations affiliated with the North American Baptist Conference are recognized by a group exemption. North American Baptists, Inc. is an Illinois not-for-profit corporation recognized under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Enclosed with this letter is a copy of our group exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service and a copy of Page 984 of the Cumulative List of Organizations recognized under 170(c) of the Internal Revenue Code revised to October 31, 1988, indicating our continued status.

Gentlemen:

This refers to the information submitted for use in determining your status and the status of your affiliated churches for Federal income tax purposes.

Based on the information supplied, we rule that you and your affiliated churches named in the group exemption roster you submitted are exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as it is shown that you and such affiliated churches are organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes.

We have further determined that you and your exempt affiliated churches are not private foundations within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because you and they are organizations described in section 170(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Code.

You and your exempt affiliated churches are not required to file Federal income tax returns so long as you and the exempt affiliated churches retain a tax exempt status, unless you and they are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511, of the Code. If you and the exempt affiliated churches are subject to this tax, it will be necessary to file an income tax return on Form 990-T. In this letter we are not determining whether any of your or their present or proposed activities is unrelated business as defined in section 513 of the Code. Further you and your exempt affiliated churches are not required to file the Return for Organizations Exempt From Federal Income Tax, Form 990, as you and they come within the specific exceptions contained in section 6033(a)(2)(A)(i) of the Code.

In re: North American Baptist General Conference

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, you and your exempt affiliated churches are not automatically exempt from other Federal excise taxes.

You and your exempt affiliated churches are not liable for the taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) unless you and such affiliated churches file a waiver of exemption certificate as provided in that Act. You and your exempt affiliated churches are not liable for the tax under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act. However, you and your exempt affiliated churches are required to withhold Federal income taxes of your and their employees. Inquiries about the waiver of exemption certificate for social security taxes, or any questions concerning excise, employment, or other Federal taxes should be addressed to the District Director, Internal Revenue Service, 17 North Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois 60603, which is your key district for exempt organization matters.

Donors may deduct contributions to you and your exempt affiliated churches as provided by section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to or for your use or to or for the use of your exempt affiliated churches are deductible for Federal estate and gift tax purposes under section 2055, 2106 and 2522 of the Code.

If you change your purposes, character, or method of operation, please let your key District Director know so that he may consider the effect on your exempt status. Also, please keep him informed of any changes in your name or address.

Each year, within 45 days after your annual accounting period closes, please send us two copies of the following information about your affiliated churches:

1. A statement describing any changes during the year in the purposes, character, or method of operation of your affiliated churches.
2. A list of the names, mailing addresses, including Postal ZIP Codes and employer identification numbers (if required for group exemption letter purposes) of affiliated churches on your group exemption roster that during the year:

- a. changed names or address;
- b. were deleted from the roster;
- c. were added to the roster.

A directory of affiliated churches may be substituted for this list if it includes the required information and identifies the affected affiliated churches according to the three categories above.

3. For affiliated churches added to the roster, a letter signed by one of your principal officers containing or attaching:

a. a statement that information upon which your present group exemption letter is based applies to the new affiliated churches;

b. a statement that each has given you written authorization to add its name to the roster;

c. a list of those to which the Service previously issued rulings or determination letters relating to exemption, and;

d. a statement that none of the new affiliated churches are private foundations as defined in section 509(a) of the Code.

4. If applicable a statement that your group exemption roster did not change during the year.

You should advise each of your exempt local churches of the exemption and the pertinent provisions of this ruling.

SITING OF FIREWORKS STANDS

PURPOSE

To ensure fireworks stands are located and installed in compliance with codes governing their installation and with the authority of the property owner. Property owners who approve their location and installation must be totally aware of the consequences of fireworks stands could have on vehicle parking. This standard ensures the siting of fireworks stands is in conformance with the Costa Mesa Municipal Code before being set in place and is authorized by the person (s) having control of the property.

REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 100 feet from any gasoline dispenser or room in which vehicles containing gasoline are repaired; a minimum distance of 35 feet to any structure; a minimum distance of 5 feet to any sidewalk or 10 feet from curbing where no sidewalk exists; no parking within 10 feet of fireworks stand; provide adult night watchperson.

REQUIRED SUBMITTAL

A site map shall be provided to the Fire Prevention Bureau prior to siting fireworks stands in the City of Costa Mesa (deliver with application to the Finance Department). The site plan shall be drawn to scale and show the following at a minimum: all property lines; surrounding streets and sidewalks with distance to stand indicated; all buildings within 100 feet of the stand with distance to buildings and occupancy use of buildings indicated; all parking spaces within 100 feet of stand; location of adult night watchperson; location and type of power source; a written statement of how **NO PARKING** within 10 feet will be enforced.

*Placement, setback requirements and property owners/agents authorization for fireworks stand is as follows:


LOCATION

Vacant lots on which stands are erected and maintained shall be free of all weeds and combustible material before the erection of any fireworks stand. It shall be the responsibility of the stand operator to see that this procedure is carried out.

The minimum placement requirements: 1) 100 feet from any gasoline dispenser or storage; 2) 35 feet from any structure; 3) 5 feet from sidewalks or 10 feet from curbing if no sidewalks; 4) location of power source if any (existing source "ES" or generator "G"). *Also note on site plan the location of the adult night watchperson (noted on site plan as "WP").
