RECOMMENDATION:

1. Accept the work performed by Sancon Technologies, Inc. and authorize the Deputy City Clerk to file the Notice of Completion.
2. Release the Labor and Material Bond seven months after the filing date; release the Faithful Performance Bond twelve months after the filing date; and release the retention monies 35 days after the Notice of Completion filing date.

BACKGROUND:

At the regular Council meeting of April 5, 2004, a construction contract in the amount of \$22,010 was awarded to Sancon Technologies, Inc., 5881 Engineer Drive, Huntington Beach, CA 92649.

The existing public storm drain system consisted of a corrugated metal pipe, which is located between 1843 and 1844 Jamaica Road. As part of the maintenance process, the corrugated metal pipeline was videotaped and the pipeline was determined to be partially deteriorated. The recommended reconstruction process was to install a poly vinyl chloride (PVC) liner.

The scope of work for this project included restoring the deteriorated pipeline by installing a resin-impregnated flexible tube inside the existing pipe and then curing it with hot water to form a rigid lining.

ANALYSIS:

The work required by the contract documents was completed without changes on May 10, 2004, to the satisfaction of the City Engineer and the Director of Public Services. The final contract cost amounted to \$22,010. A report of the final costs is shown herein as "Attachment 1."

Engineering staff has collected and reviewed all labor compliance documents for adherence with the project guidelines. As of this date, there are no Stop Notices filed against the monies due to Sancon Technologies, Inc.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

There were no alternatives considered for this item.

FISCAL REVIEW:

There is no fiscal impact on this item.

LEGAL REVIEW:

There is no legal review required on this item.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize staff to file the Notice of Completion; release the remaining retention monies 35 days after the Notice of Completion filing date; and release the bonds accordingly.
