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RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission approve the goals for Fiscal year 2004 and approve expenditures as approved in the Fiscal Review Section of this report.

BACKGROUND:

At the October 19, 1998 meeting the City Council approved a motion adopting Council Policy 500-11, which provides direction for the implementation of Fairview Park Master Plan (Attachment A). The policy was updated on July 17, 2000 (Attachment B) and revised January 9, 2003 (Attachment C).

Item "D" of the policy requires that in December of each year, the Public Services Department send the Parks and Recreation Commission an annual report describing progress that has been made on the implementation of the Master Plan and to describe the efforts to be taken in the following year. This is being brought forward in November in case of the possibility of no meeting in December.

Fairview Park Master Plan.

Two public workshops were held on July 11, 2002 and August 15, 2002, to reconfirm the recommendations of the Parks and Recreation Commission and staff. These recommendations were then considered at the November 18, 2002 and December 2002 City Council meetings. At these meetings, Council reconfirmed the existing elements with the following general exceptions:

- 60-car parking lot on the west side of Placentia Avenue near the Fairview storm channel was deleted from the Master Plan.
- The dog park was deleted from the Master Plan.
- The pond was deleted from the Master Plan.
- The botanical garden was deleted from the Master Plan.
- The Model Engineer Railroad tracks on the west side of Placentia Avenue were deleted from the Master Plan.
- Meeting rooms/multi-purpose rooms were approved as part of the museum element of the Master Plan.



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
