RECOMMENDATION

Make appointment to fill a vacancy on the Planning Commission.

BACKGROUND

The resignation of Planning Commissioner Jim Fitzpatrick has left a vacancy on the Planning Commission. His term expires February 2015.

A call for applications was issued, and the deadline to receive applications for the Planning Commission vacancy was 5PM Friday, June 29, 2012. Per Council Policy 000-2.5, the City Clerk verified that the following seven applicants are qualified residents and electors of the City. (Attachment 1, Applications)

On July 9, 2012, the Planning Commission received a staff report and recommended that City Council appoint Jeff Mathews to fill this vacancy.

ANALYSIS

Per Council Policy 000-2.5, the City Council makes appointments to the Planning Commission by majority vote. However, the City Attorney's office has indicated that the Planning Commission, as an advisory body to the City Council, may also consider the applications and make a recommendation to the City Council. (Attachment 3, Policy)

The person appointed to serve would be at the pleasure of the City Council. The Commissioners' terms are for four years, except that initial appointments were made for two years in order to have staggered terms, as follows: (Attachment 2, Roster)

- Colin McCarthy February 2013
- Sam Clark February 2013
- Rob Dickson February 2015
- Jim Fitzpatrick February 2015 – resigned
- Edward Salcedo February 2015

ALTERNATIVES

Per Council Policy 000-2.5, the next regular appointment of Planning Commissioners will occur at the City Council meeting on January 15, 2013 following the General Election. Council could decide to keep the position vacant until that time. However, a 4-member Commission would create conditions for tie votes (2-2).

FISCAL ANALYSIS

There is no fiscal impact with this item.

LEGAL ANALYSIS


The City Attorney's office has confirmed that the new Commissioner could assume immediate responsibilities for the next Planning Commission meeting, scheduled August 13, 2012.

1. Indicate why you wish to serve on this Commission/Committee/Board:

I am a resident of the City of Costa Mesa and reside in the Providence Park Community. The resignation of Planning Commissioner Fitzpatrick resulted in an untimely departure of a gentleman that brought a lot of valuable skill-sets, time and energy to the important responsibilities of Planning Commission decision-making. The Planning Commission has now been delegated by the Mayor of the City the responsibility to appoint an Interim Planning Commissioner to fill the seat that Mr. Fitzpatrick vacated. The interim position is for a period beginning August 2012 and ending in January 2012.

Because of the limited time of the appointment and the potential inability for an appointee to become fully familiar with the conduct of business of the Planning Commission within that time, it is my opinion that appointment of an individual with the background, education, experience and skill-set and with the working knowledge of the California Environmental Quality Act, State of California Planning and Zoning Laws, General Plans, Zoning Ordinances, and Municipal Codes would be a valuable asset in the appointment of an Interim Planning Commissioner.

It is for this reason that I am prepared to step up and offer my service, time, and resources to this position and to provide the leadership and support that is required of a Planning Commissioner in the decision-making process of planning, community development and revitalization of the City of Costa Mesa. In addition because of my experience with the formulation of General Plan policies and in facilitating community participation and preparation of General Plan documents, I believe that I could be a valuable asset to the Planning Commission and the City's staff as the City proceeds with its General Plan Update over the next several months, so as to establish a strong foundation for the entire process unfolding over the next 18-months, particularly considering the budget cutbacks that the City has and continues to face in the Planning Department. 

BACKGROUND

The City Council has changed the method it uses to appoint the members of the Planning Commission and the Parks and Recreation Commission so that appointments to each of these commissions is by majority vote. The persons appointed serve at the pleasure of the City Council. The commissioners' terms are for four years except that initial appointments under Ordinance number 04-17 for two of the Planning Commissioners and two of the Parks and Recreation Commissioners, chosen randomly, shall be for two years in order to have staggered terms.

PURPOSE

To establish certain procedures governing the appointment of Planning and Parks and Recreation commissioners and related matters.

PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES

1. Appointments

- a. The City Manager will put on the City Council agenda for the second regular City Council meeting in January following each General Election the matter of appointment of commissioners for the Planning Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission. Appointments will be needed to fill any vacancies caused by the expiration of commission member terms.
- b. The City Manager will give advance notice of the calendaring of this matter to the Council Members.
- c. Prior to the scheduled Council meeting, the City Manager will also cause public notice to be given of the number and type of commission appointments to be made and invite any interested persons to submit to his office their name, resume, and statement of interest in the commission appointment desired. All such applications received will be supplied to the Council Members.
- d. At the scheduled Council meeting when this matter is called for consideration, each Council Member may make nominations of persons to be appointed to each commission to be voted on by the entire council.

2. Qualifications

- a. Commissioners must be residents and qualified electors of the City. The City Clerk shall verify that applicants satisfy these qualifications.
- b. No commissioner shall be a regular, full-time employee of the City, nor a Council Member.
- c. The Council Members shall select their nominee(s) based on the individual Council Member's judgment that his or her nominee(s) are the best qualified persons for these commissions.
- d. The appointments shall be from among persons who have submitted applications.

3. Terms

- a. Each commissioner will serve a term of four years except that upon initial appointment following adoption of this Policy Revision and Ordinance Number 04-17, two members of each commission, selected at random, shall serve a term of two years.
- b. Notwithstanding subdivision 3.a above, a commissioner will continue to serve until a replacement commissioner has been appointed and qualified.
- c. A commissioner's term shall automatically terminate upon his or her ceasing to be qualified under section 2 above.

4. Removal

- a. A Council Member may request consideration of removal of a Commissioner by placing the removal on a Council agenda.
- b. When this matter is called for consideration, The City Council may remove any member of either commission by majority vote.

5. Compensation

Compensation for the commissioners will be set from time to time by City Council resolution.

6. Absences

The provisions in Costa Mesa Municipal Code, section 13-10(d) and (e) describing excusable absences and absences resulting in termination of office shall govern both Planning and Parks and Recreation commissioners. An absence without cause from three consecutive meetings shall automatically end a commissioner's term of office.

7. Additional Policies

Except as provided in this policy, the Planning Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission shall be guided by the policies set forth in the Commissions/Committees/Boards Handbook. In case of any inconsistencies between this policy and the Handbook, the provisions in this policy shall govern these commissions. The Handbook includes material on such items as:

- Compensation
- Conflict of Interest
- Formal Communication with City Council
- Legislative Activity
- Oath of Allegiance
- Staff Liaison Roles
