RECOMMENDED ACTION

Release the Performance and Labor and Material Bonds (Certificate No. 784497S) in the amounts of \$15,000.00 each for street improvements and (Certificate No.784907S) for setting corner monuments in the amount of \$500.00 to White-Warmington Tustin Avenue Associates, L.P. (Developer), 3090 Pullman Street, Costa Mesa, California 92626.

BACKGROUND

On April 8, 2013, the City Council approved Final Map Tract No.17519 for the subdivision of fourteen (14) lots for common interest development under the small lot subdivision. The Engineering Division required the setting of durable monuments at corners of exterior and interior lots. The Performance Bond in the amount of \$500.00 was received and accepted by the Public Services Department as a guarantee for the setting of the monuments. Also, the Engineering Division issued Encroachment Permit No. PS14-00082 to Matt White Custom Homes Inc. (Contractor), for the construction of street improvements within Tustin Avenue. The Encroachment Permit allowed for the construction of curb and gutter, sidewalk, drive approach, curb drains and utility connections. The Performance and Labor and Material Bonds in the amounts of \$15,000.00 each were received and accepted by the Public Services Department as a guarantee for the construction of the improvements.

ANALYSIS

All conditions of the Encroachment Permit have been met and the work has been completed and accepted by the Public Services Department.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The alternative to this Council action would be to retain the Performance and Labor and Material Bonds. Costa Mesa Municipal Code Section 15-32 states, "The condition of said bond shall be that the applicant will perform the work authorized by any permit issued pursuant to this chapter in a good and workmanlike manner and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer." These conditions have been met; therefore, retention of the bonds would be in violation of the Municipal Code.

FISCAL REVIEW

There is no fiscal impact to the City relative to this item.

LEGAL REVIEW

There is no legal review required relative to this item.

CONCLUSION

All of the required conditions of the Encroachment Permit have been completed by the contractor, and all of the monuments have been set by the Engineer. Therefore, staff recommends that the Performance and Labor and Material Bonds in the amounts of \$15,000.00 each, and the bond for setting corner monuments in the amount of \$500.00 be released to White-Warmington Tustin Avenue Associates, L.P.
