



What's Special About Fairview Park?

Throughout the 208 acres of land, Fairview Park is known for its different ecosystems including the wetlands, grasslands, canyon, bluffs, and vernal pools. Overall, the park is home to 13 rare plant species, 11 regulated bird species, and 2 federally listed fairy shrimp species. Additionally, the varied terrain and soil types throughout the park support several specific areas of diverse flora and fauna. The grasslands of the east hillsides provide habitat for California's state grass, Purple Needle Grass. Purple Needle Grass is a resilient native grass that can live up to 300 years old and grow its roots up to 20 feet deep. With the rains this past spring, the grasslands also supported a great crop of CA wildflowers such as purple lupine. Exclusively within the vernal pool habitat, an additional 37 plant species can be found. Of those species, 7 plants are listed as rare or endangered, and 7 plants represent the only recorded population of that plant in Orange County. Some of the species residing in the vernal pools include Mud Nama, San Diego Button Celery, and Alkali Popcorn Flower.

The canyon leading from the upper mesa to the wetlands has been under restoration for a few years with dedicated volunteers removing invasive plant species and re-populating with natives. The process of restoring can take time, but can also produce results along the way. Through the City/ICRE 2nd Saturday volunteer workdays, a Coastal Sage Scrub program has been implemented and we've seen the return of the CA gnatcatchers, a Federally listed endangered bird species.

The west side bluffs and grasslands, together with the tree canopy of the wetlands and Talbert Park, attract a diverse population of migratory birds to the park in the fall and winter. With the open lands and trees, the birds can find abundant small creatures for food and tree tops for resting spots. They also love the natural wind patterns that occur on the mesa; you can often see them soaring in the breeze off the bluffs.

There's plenty special about Fairview Park, and we invite you to come out and learn, hike, volunteer, and enjoy the rewards and respite of nature in your City!






