

Dear Members of the City Council,

The following is a summary of recent activities over the past week:

### Code Enforcement

**180 Block of E. 19th St:** Responded to a CM Connect complaint of transient encampment in the parking lot. Received a photo of people camping and items and shopping carts scattered over the property (see attached photo). Did not observe the issue during my visit. **Spoke to the owner of the nearby business who was aware of the issue and complained of ongoing camping issues. Owner was told to call PD whenever the issue was observed. Spoke to a friend of the reported transients and suggested he tell his friends the owner no longer wants them on his property.**

**1900 Block of Meyer Pl:** Continues to be a nuisance with a growing encampment. Suggested property owner post no trespass signs but he still has not done so. **Will issue Violation Notice to the owner for the continuing nuisance.**

**2200 Block of Harbor Blvd:** Observed female sitting bent over on a bus bench appearing incoherent. **Checked to determine if medical aid was needed. Once female responded I recognized her as a transient frequenting Harbor Blvd. Female appeared to be under the influence of something but did not want any help.**

**2100 Block of College Ave:** CM Connect report of transient camping on sidewalk with numerous items. **Did not observe the reported person when visiting the location, will monitor.**

**1800 Block of Newport Blvd:** CM Connect report of male transient with shopping carts camping on sidewalk. **Did not observe the reported person when visiting the location, will monitor.**

### Outreach

**MEDICAL LINKAGE:** Outreach linked a client to a therapy appointment at SOS then debriefed with the homeless liaison director afterwards to make referral for the client to be linked to SSI for disability.

**DOCUMENTATION LINKAGE:** Outreach is assisting a client who is pending a reconnection back to Canada. Outreach will have to take the client to the Canadian Consulate and pay for the emergency passport. Once the passport arrives, he will have 7 days to return to Canada.

**FIELD SUPPORT:** Outreach provided a client with a 30-Day Disabled Bus Pass to get around from the Salvation Army Fullerton to Costa Mesa for his medical appointments. Outreach also assisted a chronically homeless female with obtaining a CA ID. Additionally, with the assistance of Fresh Beginnings Ministries, Outreach assisted a client who was in need of food for her family and the family was provided with food until they received their monthly payment.

**FIELD SUPPORT:** Outreach has been providing assistance to a mother whose daughter fell out of rehab and has been hospitalized for MERSA. The daughter is not allowed to return to the medical detox; thus Outreach has been working to locate another detox facility she can enroll in.

**OTHER:** Outreach is pleased to announce that the Community Impact Teams worked at Newport Rib Company and Mariners Church Irvine this week doing landscaping and cleaning.

**NEW TRANSIENT:** New transient from Oklahoma came looking for resources as she and her husband came here to stay with family. Her husband was placed in the hospital on a 5150 hold and she is waiting for his release. Outreach provided her with various resources and organizations to contact regarding assistance.

**MENTAL HEALTH LINKAGE:** Outreach linked former Costa Mesa resident who is new residing in permanent supportive housing to the County Behavioral Health. He was also linked to Social Security and will begin the process for SSI.
