WASTE HAULER FRANCHISE

non-exclusive franchise with annual permit for temporary and recurring for-hire hauling services

CONTRACTOR SELF-HAUL

annual permit for contractors that self-haul materials generated from their primary business activity



annual permit \$200
permit fee



provide list of

provide general and

insurance and required

OWNERS/BUILDERS

property owners equipped to self-haul

- no annual permit or fee
- subject to per-project fee
- must report per-project diversion and provide weight tickets (minimum 65% diversion required)
- may rent vehicle to haul; must provide copy of rental contract or receipt

WHAT ARE MY PROJECT OPTIONS?

***Bins in Public Right-of-Way (ROW):**

A \$40 temporary dumpster permit for up to 2 weeks is required for all dumpsters placed in the public ROW. Bins are only permitted by authorized/permitted haulers; bins illegally placed in the public ROW may be subject to confiscation.

Non-compliance Penalties:


- Unauthorized hauling = 3% of project value or \$1,000, whichever is greater
- No weight tickets = 3x per-project fee
- Failure to meet 65% waste diversion = 2x per-project fee

The City of Costa Mesa requires compliance with two waste related components: (1) Waste Hauling and (2) Recycling.

STEP 1

All hauling activity is subject to the City of Costa Mesa's Municipal Code requirements. All property owners and contractors are required to comply with one of the three hauling options on the backside of this handout.

STEP 2

All construction and demolition projects are subject to the 2016 CALGreen Building Code 65% waste diversion requirement. If any material is hauled offsite for reuse purposes, comply with above hauling options.
