NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Costa Mesa Zoning Administrator will render a decision on **Thursday, August 8, 2019**, or as soon as possible thereafter, on the following items:

PA-18-17 A1- Randy Weiner, 3505 Cadillac Ave., Unit M-103

Zone: MP (Industrial Park) and PDI (Planned Development Industrial)

Description: Planning Applications 18-06 A2 and 18-17 A1 are requests for minor modifications to previously-approved conditional use permits (CUPs) for marijuana manufacturing, processing, and distribution facilities. These CUPs were previously approved by the Planning Commission per the city ballot initiative referred to as Measure X codified as Titles 9 and 13 of the Costa Mesa Municipal Code. The proposal would modify conditions including but not limited to: Clarifying the expiration date for approved CUPs; prohibiting distribution from midnight to 5AM and removing other references to hours of operation; and applying standard conditions for outdoor loading when applicable. No cultivation or dispensing of marijuana is authorized by these proposed amendments.

Environmental Determination: The project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Class 1), Existing Facilities.
