**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Costa Mesa Zoning Administrator will render a decision on **Thursday, September 5, 2019**, or as soon as possible thereafter, on the following item:

**Application No.:** PA-18-04 A2

**Applicant:** Se7enLeaf, LLC

**Site Address:** 3505 Cadillac Ave., Unit L3

**Zone:** PDI (Planned Development Industrial)

**Description:** Planning Application 18-04 A2 is a request for a minor modification to previously-approved conditional use permit (CUP) for a marijuana manufacturing, processing, and distribution facility. This CUP was previously approved by the Planning Commission per the city ballot initiative referred to as Measure X, codified as Titles 9 and 13 of the Costa Mesa Municipal Code. The proposal would modify conditions including but not limited to: Clarifying the expiration date for approved CUP; prohibiting distribution from midnight to 5AM and removing other references to hours of operation; and applying standard conditions for security and loading when applicable. No cultivation or dispensing of marijuana is authorized by these proposed amendments.

**Environmental Determination:** The project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Class 1), Existing Facilities.
