Coronavirus strikes Italy: Austria blocks ALL trains crossing the border after THREE people die and more than 150 fall ill in outbreak - as Venice carnival is cancelled and Armani fashion show is axed, with 12 towns put into lockdown

- Authorities have halted all train traffic to and from Italy following fears that that passengers might be infected

A coronavirus scare sparked a snap travel freeze between Austria and Italy, as the country scrambled to block the deadly infection breaching the border.

Ministers in Rome are firefighting a spike in the number of cases as the virus spreads across the country, with the spread of the outbreak.

But the jump in confirmed diagnoses to 155 has made neighbouring countries hyper-sensitive, and tonight saw Austria prevent a suspected contaminated train from crossing the border.

The train carrying about 300 passengers from Venice to Munich was halted on the Italian side of the Brenner for four hours before two people who had come down with flu-like symptoms tested negative.

Austria's interior ministry later said in a statement: 'We can give the all-clear,' but added all passengers disembarking in would have their identities checked as a precaution.
