Re: Use of Fairview Developmental Center for Housing COVID-19 Patients

Dear Dr. Angell:

The County of Orange has received your offer of a conference call this weekend between County Health Officer Dr. Nichole Quick and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Director Dr. Robert Redfield, Health and Human Services Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response Dr. Robert Kadlec, yourself, and other state and federal officials to respond to questions about the federal operations discussed for Fairview Developmental Center.

The decision to house individuals infected with COVID-19 is a decision much broader than the County of Orange. All stakeholders including the City of Costa Mesa, surrounding cities, hospitals, first responders and local, state, and federal elected officials need to be brought into the conversation and provided information and an opportunity to ask questions at the same time. The County does not believe a conference call hastily arranged with the County Health Officer over the weekend is the appropriate process to address the concerns of the community.

The County will entertain participating with other stakeholders in a face-to-face meeting in Orange County with state and federal officials to discuss the proposed federal operation at Fairview Developmental Center. The County would expect stakeholders to be provided with a comprehensive incident management plan, including provisions for isolation of patients consistent with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance, transport and hospitalization, infection control, security, workforce plans, enforcement of federal isolation orders, and steps to minimize risk for COVID-19 transmission in Orange County
